**Gleneagles Hong Kong Hospital provides 50 all-inclusive and fixed-price medical packages
High-quality healthcare services and price transparency to meet patient needs**

(13 February 2017 – Hong Kong) Dedicated to delivering excellent healthcare services for Hong Kong people, Gleneagles Hong Kong Hospital (GHK) will be the first private hospital to provide at least 51% of inpatient bed days at packaged rates, with 70% of the bed days set aside for local residents. At the initial stage, GHK will provide 50 medical packages when it opens. All packages are fixed-price and all-inclusive in nature, and fee advisory services will be offered to all patients before admission to help patients better manage costs and make informed decisions.

The standard packages cover procedures in ENT (eye, nose, throat), endoscopy, general surgery, gynaecology, ophthalmology, orthopaedic and urology. These packages will start from the price of HK\$13,180. Wherever appropriate, packages offer different surgical and equipment options to meet different patients' needs and conditions.

“The standard packages will initially focus on commonly encountered clinical conditions with long waiting time. We aim to progressively increase the number of packages to 150 that can cater for more critical conditions such as cancer and heart diseases,” says Dr Kelvin Loh, Interim Chief Executive Officer of GHK. “Medical package is a relatively new concept in Hong Kong, we will continue to review and refine the model to meet patients' needs.”

Mr Rufin Mak, Executive Director of NWS Holdings, says, “GHK is committed to offering excellent healthcare services and care to patients and users. We consider it equally important to provide a comfortable and user-friendly environment. The hospital is architecturally designed not only to optimise accessibility and operational functionality but also offer a warm and healing environment, reflecting our vision of building a top-notch private hospital in Hong Kong.”

The clinical criteria for GHK's medical packages are developed in consultation with Li Ka Shing Faculty of Medicine of The University of Hong Kong (“HKU”), which oversees GHK's clinical governance as its exclusive clinical partner. Treatment options, patient selection criteria and lengths of stay are based on input from clinical experts, supported by scientific evidence whenever appropriate. HKU is not responsible for setting prices or costing of the packages.

The all-inclusive packages include doctor's fee, room charges, diagnostic procedures, treatment procedures, operating theatre charges, anaesthetic fees, nursing care, medications, equipment charges, consumables, implants and meals. Packages will also allow for complications that may require re-operation and intensive care within the prescribed length of stay.

To provide more option to patients, GHK will also offer an extension package to be charged on a per day basis for patients who opts to stay longer. Extension packages are also all-inclusive in nature, with the exception of services such as re-operation and intensive care.

GHK will provide quotations on packaged services and advise patients on any additional charges before proceeding with any services or procedures. Items that are excluded from the package fee will be stated clearly on the quotation. The full list of packages and their prices will be available on the hospital website.
